Central Bank of Belize (CBB) Act

Section 22 of the CBB Act gives CBB the sole right to issue Belize currency notes & coins.

The Banking & Currency Department of the CBB is responsible for the issuance of Belize currency notes.

Notes Issued before CBB

- Before 1976 "Board of the Commissioners of Currency"- The Government of British Honduras & The Government of Belize notes - can only be redeemed at CBB since they are not legal tender.
- 1976 1981 "The Monetary Authority of Belize" notes - are the liability of CBB & are therefore legal tender. Section 62 of the CBB Act empowers CBB to accept notes and coins issued under the Monetary Authority of Belize as legal obligations of the CBB.

Notes issued by CBB

- The first currency notes issued by CBB was in 1983:-\$100, \$20, \$10, \$5 & \$1.
- In May 1990 the CBB put into circulation a new family of notes:- \$100, \$50, \$20, \$10, \$5, \$2 & \$1. In this same year, the \$1 note was replaced by the \$1 coin.
- In <u>June 1998</u> all the notes had their first security enhancement upgrade.
- In <u>June 2003</u> both the \$100 & the \$20 notes were upgraded a second time.

Role of CBB in Suppressing Circulation of Counterfeit Belize Currency Notes

- Protect the notes' integrity by using security features & designs to assist the public in recognizing genuine notes.
- Educational Campaign:
 - Countrywide campaign to launch new issues
 - TV & Radio Ads
 - Distribution of posters & brochures
 - "Know Your Money" Presentations by De La Rue
 - Quarterly "Know Your Money" Ads
 - "Know Your Money" page on Central Bank Website:
 - www.centralbank.org.bz
 - Ensure that the notes in circulation are in good condition, so they can be easily recognized as genuine by users.
- Work with the police to provide counterfeit analysis & court case reports.

Principal Security Features "Look, Feel, Tilt"

- 1. Watermark with denominational electrotype (jaguar/sleeping giant)
- 2. Windowed security thread
- 3. See-through feature
- 4. Novel Numbering
- 5. Intaglio
- 6. Intaglio over-foil feature (blue fish)
- 7. Hologram with intaglio overprint (periwinkle flower)
- 8. Multi-redundant hologram
- 9. Actual Size: \$100 & \$50 (150mm X 75mm) \$20, \$10, \$5, \$2 (140mm X 70mm)

Role of the Public in Suppressing Counterfeit Circulation

Be vigilant - know your money; check each note every time <u>before</u> accepting it.

- Report suspected notes to the Police at once!!!
- Counterfeit notes should be taken to the nearest Police Department immediately.
- If a note is suspected to be counterfeit, contact the Banking & Currency Department at CBB for assistance.

Counterfeit Notes

- CBB is not legally obligated to honor counterfeit notes.
- It is a criminal offence to reproduce or be in possession of counterfeit note(s) & can be be liable for imprisonment of up to 10 years.
